The officer purchased the three sewing machines and all of the necessary materials needed from Buenos Aires. The goal is to make clothing that will sell well in the area, which include: sweatshirts, t-shirts, and sport jackets. Working with the Captain are two ladies and one gentleman. Recently, a dress making course held once a week for the community and the Home League members has commenced. This project has benefited the Salvation Army greatly as a means of communication by connecting them with the community at large. The local team experienced a great deal of motivation and considered this project as an opportunity to develop their capacity and creativity. The outpost has already received the first income due to the selling of the first production of clothing!

## Singapore, Malaysia, and Myanmar Territory

In West Malaysia at Puchong Kuala Lumpur, a four story shop / office block was purchased as a regional centre for Malaysia and specifically for Kuala Lumpur. This building significantly contributes to the need for expansion of programs and services, and also assists in raising the profile of the Salvation Army in this cosmopolitan city.

The Malaysia Public Relations office has relocated from a very cramped condition at the Kuala Lumpur Corps to the second floor of a modern, spacious facility which provides offices, a conference room, and a meeting room. A Liaison Officer for Malaysia has been appointed to represent the Territorial Commander in Malaysian affairs. This officer is also located in this building as a result of a desire to reach out in to the developing and fast growing community in the area of Kuala Lumpur. Community Services has also relocated to Puchong and their programs and services run from within this building as well.

In Banting in the West Malaysia division, the Salvation Army purchased a newly constructed terrace house in a residential development on the outskirts of Banting Township. The location of the quarters is in the newer area of the town and therefore is well positioned and assessable. Additional to purchasing the quarters, the Salvation Army supplied the home with furnishings. It was important that the Salvation Army have quarters to help consolidate the presence of the Army in Banting where there is a thriving Tamil speaking congregation.

The Officer can now dwell peacefully in the house and take care of the spiritual leadership of the Soldiers. Before the construction of the quarters, the Officer lived in a rental house and was a considerable distance away from the corps. This made pastoring the church quite difficult, but because of this new facility, the Soldier's and the Officer are able to be in more direct contact.

## India South Western

In the Nedumangad division, there is a beautiful new corps in Vettampally. The Salvation Army India South Western Territory constructed this remarkable hall for worship, now known as the Perumpally corps. It has the capacity to hold two hundred people, and is decorated and furnished with fans, tube lights, and fancy lights by the people of that community. "Implementation of this project boosts the enthusiasm of the people in worshipping and serving God. They considered it an answer to their prayer for long years. This will help the future ministry of the Salvation Army. With the implementation of the project, they have a church hall having sufficient place to worship together, can gather together for home league, young people can do their meetings and programs, junior home league, and other programs can conduct. All of these activities will strengthen the work of the Salvation Army and will be a great impact in the community for Jesus Christ. In the Peermade division, the Salvation Army India South Western Territory constructed a beautiful officer's quarters for the Pazhayaviduthy corps. The quarters have a sitting room, three bedrooms, a kitchen, an attached bath room and a store room.



## India Eastern Territory

In Aizawl, India at the Salvation Army Territorial Headquarters, a fly over bridge has been constructed between Booth Mansion Hall and the Temple Main gate, as well as a new dining hall, kitchen, and a newly furnished guest room. These additions will benefit the Salvation Army as they host visitors in their building. The people of India Eastern Territory are quite proud of their headquarters and are grateful for the assistance of the USA Eastern Territory in this project.

In the Midland division, at the Sesawng corps, the Salvation Army is now able to have regular Y.P. meetings in their own Y.P Prayer Hall. The people of Sesawng are most thankful to USA Eastern Territory for their generous giving that has made this possible.

In the Southern Division of India, in the town of Lunglei, the Salvation Army has completed their Divisional Headquarters. Within this structure, there is a room for the Divisional Commander, the Divisional Youth Secretary, Cashiers rooms, a Council room and a DDWM and WDO room. The Divisional Commander and his family live comfortably and happily on the top of the building – and wish to thank the USA Eastern Territory for their support and willingness to help through this project.
